Take a moment to read it in Luke 24:13-25.

- ✠ This passage is striking on the range of emotions it displays. What is the emotional arc from beginning to end?
- ✠ Which of these emotions resonate with you today? Where are we on this arc?
- ✠ In verses 25-27, Jesus leads them in a Bible study. What did he share with them? What passages might he have referenced? What questions would you have wanted to ask? What was the impact of this Bible study on them? (v32)
- ✠ How does the story end? How can Vogel Center church reflect this passion?
