"Why Did Christ Come? – Freedom!"
Luke 4:14-21

We are incredibly blessed in our time and place that we have very little experience with slavery, but the evil of slavery has been part of the history of our world. Tragically it still exists in many places. Slavery is more than an unjust economic system, it is the erasure of someone's humanity, making them something less than God created them in His image to be.

The original hearers and readers of the Bible were very familiar with slavery and the Biblical authors used this as an image to explain the tragic power of sin. Read for example Romans chapter 6.

Peter also uses this image in his first letter to explain why Christ came. Read I Peter 1:17-21. The key word is "redeem" or "redemption". This word means to pay the price to purchase a slave and give them their freedom back.

We were slaves on "an empty way of life". It kept us prisoner and made us less than we were created to be in the image of God. But Jesus paid the redemption price in his own blood to make us free again!

Read the beauty of Isaiah's poetry in Isaiah 61:1-3 (quoted by Jesus in Luke 4). Marvel at the wonder of what Christ has done and the price he paid to set us free.
